

1. Webinar on Machine Learning









3. Webinar on DATA SCIENCE AND DATA ANALYSIS in Association With COGNITO KNOWLEDGE TECH PVT LTD


1. Webinar on Buy Back of Shares

Under the patronage of Rizvi Education Society, Hon. President Dr. Akhtar Hasan Rizvi and Hon. Director Advocate Mrs. Rubina Akhtar Hasan Rizvi, One Day Online International Conference on 'Emerging Opportunities and Challenges in Indian Economy: An Interdisciplinary Approach' concluded on 18th October 2020. The conference was jointly organised by Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Bandra (West) and Department of Law, Parul University, Vadodara, Gujarat.

We had the privilege of the presence of distinguished guests and experts who consented to be a part of the conference. Rizvi College of Arts, Sceince and Commerce is obliged to all the dignitaries. The conference commenced at 9:30 a.m. with a Welcome Address by Principal In Charge and Convener of the Conference Dr. (Mrs.) Anjum Ara Ahmed and Co - Convener Prof. (Dr.) Akil A Syed, Director & Dean, Faculty of Law, Parul University, Vadodara, Gujarat. The Chief Guest Dr. Sachin Vernekar, Dean Faculty of Management Studies Bharati Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University) Director, BVDU IMED, Incharge, Erandwane Campus, Pune, delivered an inaugural address on 'Make in India'. In his address, he explained the significance of a self-reliant economy by emphasising the concept of 'Make in India'.

Keynote address was delivered by Prof (Dr.) Kuldeep Kumar, Professor of Statistics; Bond University, Australia, on 'Impact of Bankruptcy and Fraud on Indian Economy'. 


Department: Mathematics and Statistics


Environment Awareness Committee & Nature Club






Title- A Webinar on Gender, Bullying and Victimization- How Regressive School of Thought Shapes Bullying Behavior






Title - A webinar on Importance of Women's Hygiene in Family Health




2. Online National Level Webinar on 'Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) in India'



IQAC successfully organized Online National Level Webinar on 'Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) in India' on Tuesday, 30 th March, 2021. The resource person for the webinar was Ms. Hema Mehta, Assistant Professor, Tolani College of Commerce. 450 participants registered for the webinar and 190 successfully attended the webinar. The webinar was a success due to enthusiastic and active participation of all the participants. All the queries were addressed by the resource person satisfactorily.















DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English of Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce organised a **National webinar on science fiction** on May 18, 2020, in collaboration with the Board of Studies in English, University of Mumbai. It was attended by 100 participants. Bhaswati Prasar gave a general introduction about the importance of the webinar and also gave the information regarding the people involved in organising the event.

Paul Raj, the in charge Principal of the college, welcomed the gathering; he explained how the institution was built with the able leadership of the founder, Dr. Akhtar Hasan Rizvi, with a vision to make education available to all the sectors of the society. Dr. Sudhir Nikam, the Chairperson of the Board of Studies in English at the University of Mumbai, said the focus of the conference was to expose the student fraternity to the genre of science fiction. He explained how science is inculcated in fiction. Highlighting the growth in the SF market globally with statistics about sales, he said that one book out of 10 sold in UK, and four out of 10 books sold in the US, are science fiction. He said that literature and science have provided knowledge and power to its users.


He said themes of ecology, environment, and contact with aliens, alternative history, and space and time have gained momentum in recent years. Suvarna Shinde gives a keynote address and quoted past president of India and a rocket scientist APJ Abdul Kalam: "Science is a beautiful gift of humanity, and we should not distort it." Her scholarly lecture also quoted the views and works of Isaac Asimov, Robert Heinlein, and Theodore Sturgeon. She traced the history of SF from Mary Shelley's Frankenstein (1818) through Edgar Allan Poe, Jules Verne, George Orwell, and Philip K. Dick. She discussed the difference between SF movies and fantasy works. Seat dealt with SF movies, including Artificial Intelligence, Avatar, and PK, and placed Carbon in the top rung of SF movies.

She concluded by quoting Wordsworth's "Lines Writen in Early Spring": "And much it grieved my heart to think, what man has made of man." Professor Pinaki Rao delivered a special lecture on "Science Fiction as a Literature," observing that the lockdown period has treated religion and religious beliefs as secondary, and has upheld the efforts of scientist and doctors, whi are striving hard to find a way out of the crisis. Beginning his speech with the term "Scientification" he dealt with history, myth development, and the lastest trends in SF. He cited instances from the works of Sidney Sheldon, described the various forms of future life, discussed characters including R. Daneel Olivaw from Isaac Asimov's Caves of Steel and Mr. Spock from Star Trek, and later he connected them to mythical references from the Mahabharata and the Ramayana. He also mentions The Lost World and Jurassic Park by Michael Crichton. The conclusion that SF need not necessary project into the future, but can also review the past and refer to the present day. Professor Vaishali, head of the department of English at Bangalore University, Bangalore

Karnataka, delivered a special lecture on "Feminist Science Fiction." She introduced the basic concepts of feminism and the latest trends, then discussed gender identity, human rights movements, and marginalisation issues.

Introducing the Indian feminist writings of Shashi Deshponde, she swiftly shifted to focus on the Bangladeshi Muslim SF writer Rokeya Sakhawat Hossain, and her story published in Sultana's Dreams (1905). It depicts a feminist utopia (called Ladyland) in which women run everything and men are secluded, in a mirror-image of the traditional practice of purdah. The women are aided by "electrical" technology which enables labour-free farming and flying cars; the women scientists have discovered how to harness solar power and control the weather. This results in "a sort of gender-based Planet of the Apes where the roles are reversed and the men are locked away in a technologically advanced future," There, traditional stereotypes such as men having larger brains or women being naturally weak and countered with logical representations like, "an elephant also has a bigger and heavier brain" and " a lion is stronger than a man," but neither dominates men. In Ladyland, crime is eliminated, since men were responsible for all of it.

The workday is only 2 hours long, since men used to waste six hours each day in smoking. The religion is one of love and truth. Purity is held above all, and the list of "Sacred Relations" is widely extended. The speaker then discussed the latest trends in feminist SF works by Indian women science fiction writers including Vandana Singh, Meghashri Dalavi, Rekha Baijal, Kalpana Kulshreshta, Sukanya Dutt, Shwetha Taneja, Pragnya Gowtham, Suhashini, ans others. Nandita Roy concluded by thanking the collaborators, speakers, and participants for having made the event a grand success.






♣ National Level Webinar on "National Education Policy - 2020"
