## **2. CURRICULAR DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT**

### **CERTIFICATE COURSE OFFERED IN COLLABORATION**

The Certificate course committee Convenor Mr. Mohammad Gaus Ansari in coordination with the committee members Mr. Subhash Gupta, Ms. Zahra Deghani and Ms. Shabnam took the responsibility for the smooth conduct of the certificate courses right from registration of students to the Awarding of Certificates on successful completion of the course.

### **3. TEACHING - LEARNING AND EVALUATION PROCESS**

#### **ADMISSION PROCESS**

The Admission Committee of the college comprising the Principal, Vice-Principal, Heads of the Departments and senior faculty ensures that the admission process is widely publicized and transparent. The Admissions Committee annually reviews its admission process to provide equal representation from all sections of the society. The success of the review mechanism is evidenced by the ever increasing demand for admissions over the past few years.

In the admission process the applicants are counselled by the faculty to create an awareness among the students regarding Courses offered, Career Prospects, campus culture, rules and regulations and various other Add - On and Certificate Courses designed for the holistic development of the students to help them in choosing the right course.

- **CRITERIA FOR UG ADMISSIONS**

1. Admission will be, strictly, on merit basis. In case, where aided as well unaided division/seat/subjects are available after filling the aided division/seats/subjects, admission will be granted for unaided division/seats/subjects for which, the fee structure is different (Ref. Fees Chart).
2. The college has been granted the “Minority Status” therefore admission will be granted according to rules and regulations applicable to this Category. Fifty percent seats in all courses & classes are reserved for Muslim minority.
3. Those who fail to pay the prescribed fees within the stipulated time will forfeit their claim for admission.
4. Repeaters and working students will not be granted admission
5. Students from other colleges will be admitted only if seats are available, after granting admission to in-house students after requisite permission from the competent authority and verification of their original documents.
6. All admissions will be subject to the guidelines of the University of Mumbai and Education Department Government of Maharashtra received from time to time and as decided by the Rizvi Education Society.
7. Students seeking admission must apply in the prescribed form at the beginning of each academic year.



8. A student once admitted will be considered as duly enrolled for the academic year and the student shall be liable to pay the full fees for the whole year unless, the student informs the principal in writing of his/her intention to leave the college well in advance.
9. Students granted admission to First year in unaided division will continue in unaided division of Second Year and Third Year.

In case of students belonging to Muslim/Reserved Category should also submit the Xerox of relevant document to claim Admission under the quota for the minority category. Printout of Admission form will be accepted after declaration of the merit list for granting the admission.

- **Reserved Category**

Students belonging to reserved category should submit the application form for “freeship” available in the college office with the required documents as per the chart, along with, all documents mentioned above.

Students should keep 5 xerox copies of each document they are submitting for the admission for future record.

- **Second Year / Third Year Admission**

**B.A / B.Sc. / B.Com. / B.Sc. (Computer Science)**

Students seeking Admission in SY/TY classes in different courses are required to fill in “online” admission form and submit a copy of admission form as per schedule declared for admissions. Such forms are to be submitted on declaration of FY/SY results at the end of continuous year, along with, the copies of all mark sheets of earlier examinations in which, he / she has passed or secured ATKT making him/her eligible to admit in SY/TY classes.

- **CONTINUATION OF ADMISSION**

**BMM / B.Sc. (I.T) / BMS / BBI / BAF**

Students of I/III/V semesters seeking admissions in II/IV/VI semesters are required to submit continuation of admission form before the beginning of Sem-II/IV/VI as per schedule declared for admission. Such forms should be accompanied by Original and Xerox copies of mark sheets of all lower Semesters in which the student has appeared earlier and declared Passed or Secured ATKT, making him/her eligible for higher semesters. No student will be allowed to attend classes or to appear in the examination of respective semesters, if he/she has not paid the fees of respective semester.

- **Rules of Refund of Fees**

Application for refund of fees shall be made in the prescribed form available in the college office. The refund of fees in professional courses is done on priority basis, as they are unaided course. No refund of fees is made even on priority basis after last day of admission as per University instructions. A student applying for discontinuation and refund of fees shall surrender, the Identity Card and the Library Reader’s ticket, if issued to him/her & original fees receipt, along with, his/her application

- **CAUTION MONEY & DEPOSITS**

1. The caution money and the deposits will be refunded to the student, when he / she leave, the college after completion of the course of study or cancels his/her admission.
2. The student has to apply in prescribed form for the above refund and will be required to submit the original fee receipt and Identity Card, along with, the application for refund.

## 5. Student Centric Activities

### STUDENT MEGA EVENT DIGIFEST 2020-21

All through the world, life has changed through the pandemic, and for some it is worse than the rest. We and our students are no different. Like so many else, we too have had our share of lows and losses. There was a need felt to bring in some cheer and light moments for our students – a time that they could just enjoy as children should, a little time free from worry, a little time where they could indulge in their hobbies, a little time that they could revel in their strengths. This global pandemic has taught us how adaptable we are as a human race. It was proved once again when the cultural committee of our college decided to organize a fest for the students. It was for the first time in the history of the Institution that a cultural fest was organized on a digital platform.

It was the brainchild of the convenor of our Cultural Committee Mrs. Swati Vora and the Principal Incharge Dr. Anjum Ara Ahmed to conduct a cultural fest for the students. Keeping in mind the Covid numbers and protocol to be followed, it wasn't possible to organize the annual intercollegiate cultural extravaganza, Jashn-e-Rizvi this year. So instead, the committee decided upon a fest comprising of various intra class competitions to be conducted on the online platform - **DIGIFEST**. The fest consisted of 15 events which covered various skill sets, old and new. While popular favourites like Solo Singing, Solo Dance, Personality Contest, and Mehendi Designing were the first to be added, there were new competitions in line with the need of the hour like Guessology, Mobile Photography, PPT Contests and Shayarana. We had close to 200 participants in various events. The fest was spaced over two days – 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of March 2021. An online inaugural function was held on the 27<sup>th</sup> where Mrs. Swati Vora welcomed everyone for the fest and Dr Anjum Ara Ahmed declared it open. Participation call had been floated much before, so students joined their respective competitions as per schedule, either to participate or to watch. The valedictory function was held on 30<sup>th</sup> March wherein winners for every event were announced.

This Fest would not have been possible without the support of the Management who has always had the students' best interest at heart. It was also the exemplary vision of our Principal Incharge Dr. Anjum Ara Ahmed and the Convenor of Cultural Committee Mrs. Swati Vora that conceptualized this event. Every member of the Cultural Committee worked hard and in tandem to ensure the success of the event. A special shout out goes to the technical incharge Mr Haider Zaidi and his team for ensuring a glitch free and flawless execution of the entire fest.

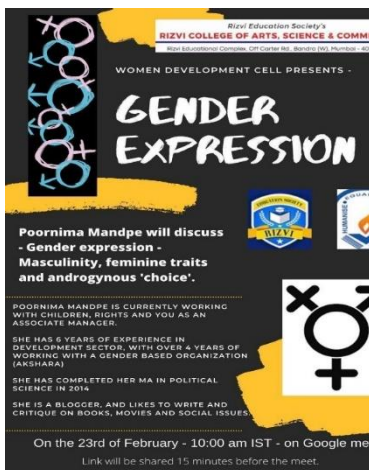
- **WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL**

- **Gender Expression- Masculine, Feminine Traits and Androgynous Choices**

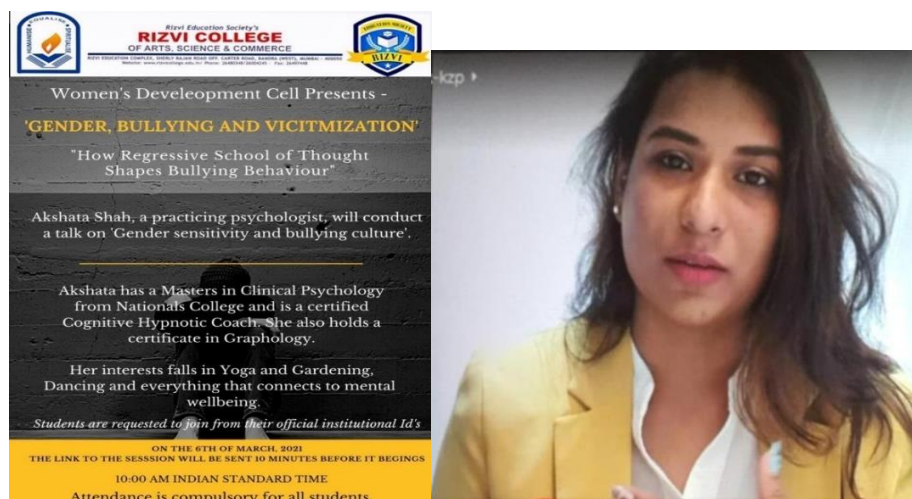

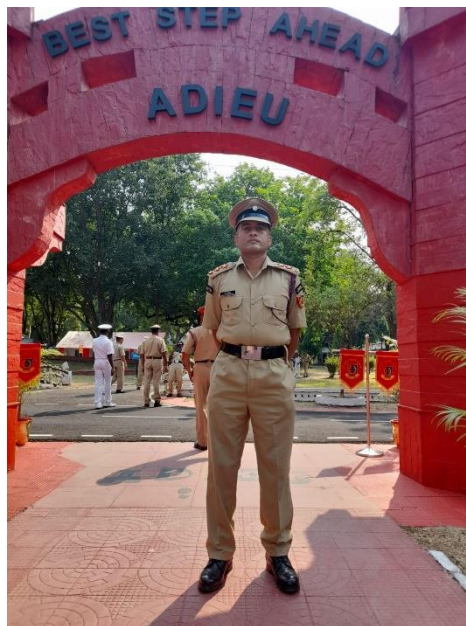
- **Republic Day**

A virtual lecture on Swayam Online Courses was organised by Dr. Rizvi Digital Library in association with Departments of Computer Science and Information Technology on 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2021 for Degree College students. The purpose of this session was to promote online learning among our students and to make them aware of the courses offered by SWAYAM, a Government initiative. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. SWAYAM seeks to bridge the digital divide for students who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital revolution and have not been able to join the mainstream of the knowledge economy. The lecture was delivered by Mr. Haider Zaidi, professor of Computer Science department. Students were given information on Swayam courses and practically shown how to register for the course and its various features. The mode of lecture was through Google Meet. Question Answer session was taken by Prof. Arif Patel and Prof. Rafat Khan. There were 100 participants in the program.

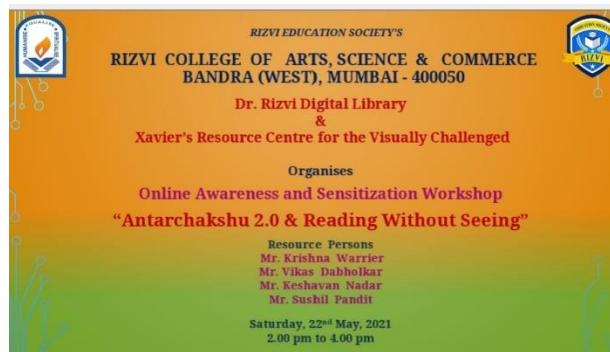
### **Online Quiz Competition on Awareness on Open Educational Resources (OER'S)**

Open Educational Resources are freely accessible, openly licensed text, media, and other digital assets that are useful for teaching, learning, and assessing as well as for research purposes. To know whether the students and teachers are aware of these useful resources, an online quiz competition was conducted on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2021. There were 20 multiple choice questions each question carrying 5 marks, total 100 marks question were given. A minimum 50% mark was the passing criteria. Out of the total 146 participants, 101 participants secured more than 50% marks.



### Online Awareness and Sensitization Workshop: Antarchakshu 2.0 & Reading without Seeing

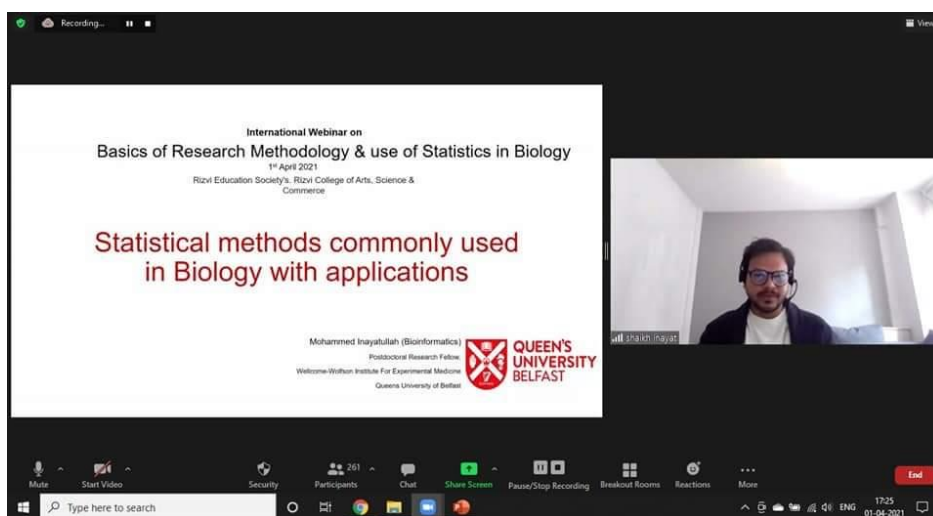

Participants gained valuable insights towards the needs of the specially abled. There were 19 teachers who participated in the program.





## DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS AND STATISTICS

The Dept. organised one International Webinar on “Basics of Research Methodology & Use of Statistics in Biology” in association with Depts. of Zoology & Botany on 01<sup>st</sup> April 2021. The Resource persons were Dr. Mohammed Inayatullah, Postdoctoral Research Fellow, Queen’s University of Belfast, UK and Dr. Ahmad Ali, Assistant Professor, Department of Life Sciences, University of Mumbai. 824 Faculty Members & Research Scholars registered for the event and about 350 participants attended the same. Out of that 48 were international registration. Both the webinars were very informative and the feedbacks given by participants were very excellent.



## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English of Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce organised a National webinar on science fiction on May 18, 2020, in collaboration with the Board of Studies in English, University of Mumbai. It was attended by 100 participants. Bhaswati Prasar gave a general introduction about the importance of the webinar and also gave the information regarding the people involved in organising the event.

Paul Raj, the incharge Principal of the college, welcomed the gathering; he explained how the institution was built with the able leadership of the founder, Dr. Akhtar Hasan Rizvi, with a vision to make education available to all the sectors of the society. Dr. Sudhir Nikam, the Chairperson of the Board of Studies in English at the University of Mumbai, said the focus of the conference was to expose the student fraternity to the genre of science fiction. He explained how science is inculcated in

fiction. Highlighting the growth in the SF market globally with statistics about sales, he said that one book out of 10 sold in UK, and four out of 10 books sold in the US, are science fiction. He said that literature and science have provided knowledge and power to its users.

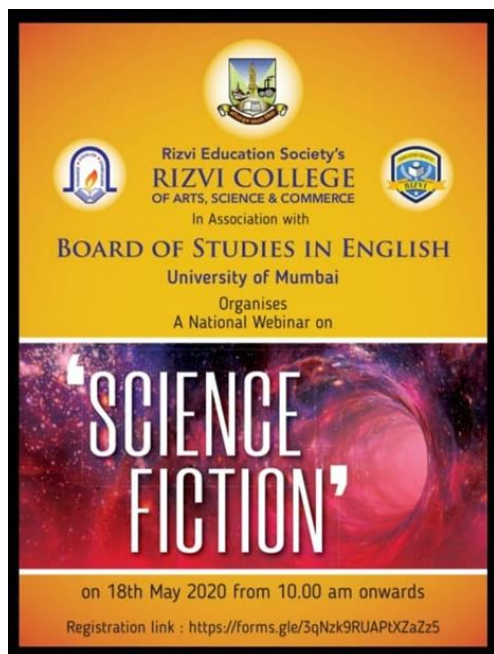
He said themes of ecology, environment, and contact with aliens, alternative history, and space and time have gained momentum in recent years. Suvarna Shinde gives a keynote address and quoted past president of India and a rocket scientist APJ Abdul Kalam: "Science is a beautiful gift of humanity, and we should not distort it." Her scholarly lecture also quoted the views and works of Isaac Asimov, Robert Heinlein, and Theodore Sturgeon. She traced the history of SF from Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* (1818) through Edgar Allan Poe, Jules Verne, George Orwell, and Philip K. Dick. She discussed the difference between SF movies and fantasy works. She dealt with SF movies, including *Artificial Intelligence*, *Avatar*, and *PK*, and placed *Carbon* in the top rung of SF movies.

She concluded by quoting Wordsworth's "Lines Written in Early Spring": "And much it grieved my heart to think, what man has made of man." Professor Pinaki Rao delivered a special lecture on "Science Fiction as a Literature," observing that the lockdown period has treated religion and religious beliefs as secondary, and has upheld the efforts of scientist and doctors, who are striving hard to find a way out of the crisis. Beginning his speech with the term "Scientification" he dealt with history, myth development, and the latest trends in SF. He cited instances from the works of Sidney Sheldon, described the various forms of future life, discussed characters including R. Daneel Olivaw from Isaac Asimov's *Caves of Steel* and Mr. Spock from *Star Trek*, and later he connected them to mythical references from the *Mahabharata* and the *Ramayana*. He also mentions *The Lost World* and *Jurassic Park* by Michael Crichton. The conclusion that SF need not necessarily project into the future, but can also review the past and refer to the present day. Professor Vaishali, head of the department of English at Bangalore University, Bangalore Karnataka, delivered a special lecture on "Feminist Science Fiction." She introduced the basic concepts of feminism and the latest trends, then discussed gender identity, human rights movements, and marginalisation issues.

Introducing the Indian feminist writings of Shashi Deshpande, she swiftly shifted to focus on the Bangladeshi Muslim SF writer Rokeya Sakhawat Hossain, and her story published in *Sultana's Dreams* (1905). It depicts a feminist utopia (called Ladyland) in which women run everything and men are secluded, in a mirror-image of the traditional practice of *purdah*. The women are aided by "electrical" technology which enables labour-free farming and flying cars; the women scientists have discovered how to harness solar power and control the weather. This results in "a sort of gender-based Planet of the Apes where the roles are reversed and the men are locked away in a technologically advanced future," There, traditional stereotypes such as men having larger brains or women being naturally weak and countered with logical representations like, "an elephant also has a bigger and heavier brain" and "a lion is stronger than a man," but neither dominates men. In Ladyland, crime is eliminated, since men were responsible for all of it.

The workday is only 2 hours long, since men used to waste six hours each day in smoking. The religion is one of love and truth. Purity is held above all, and the list of "Sacred Relations" is widely extended. ### **Story Writing Competition**

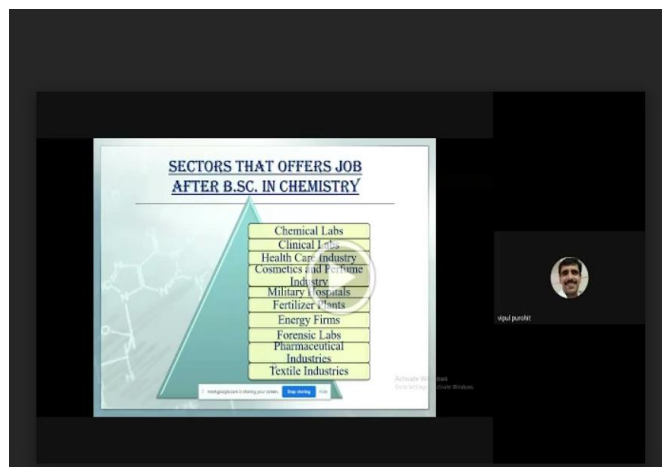

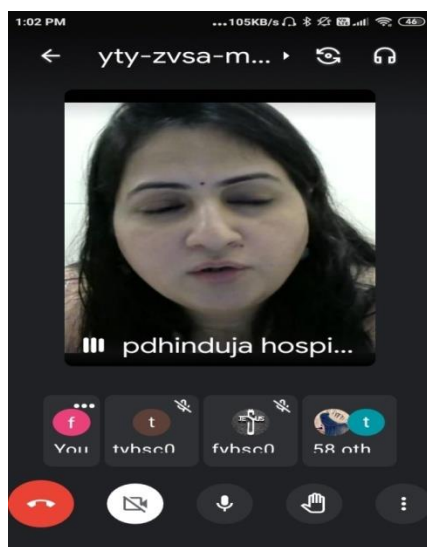
### How to Protect Yourself Online

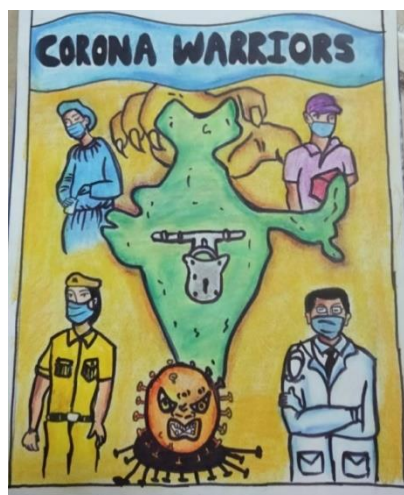


### **DEPARTMENT OF FOUNDATION COURSE**

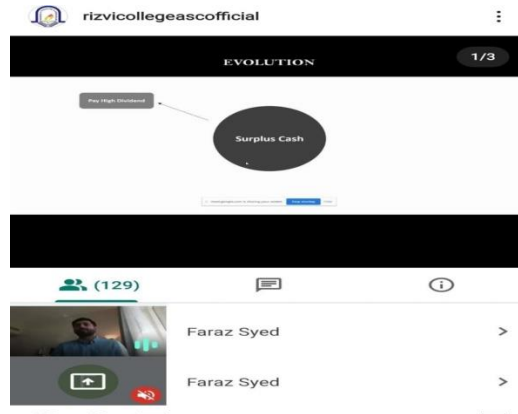
### **Webinar on Guidance for UPSC exams**

### **Guest lecture on Buy Back of Shares**

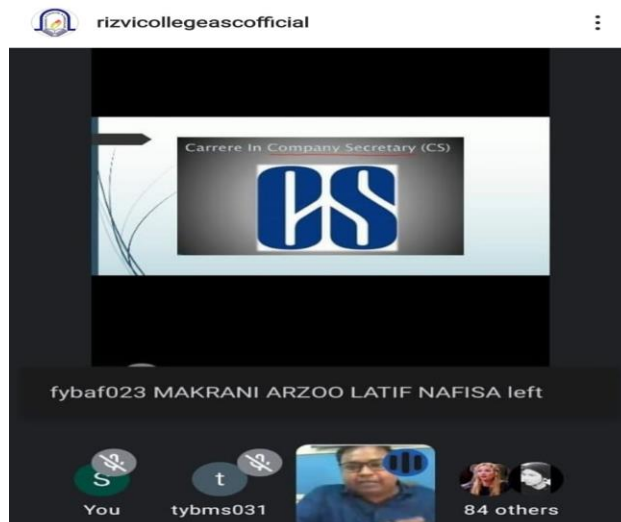

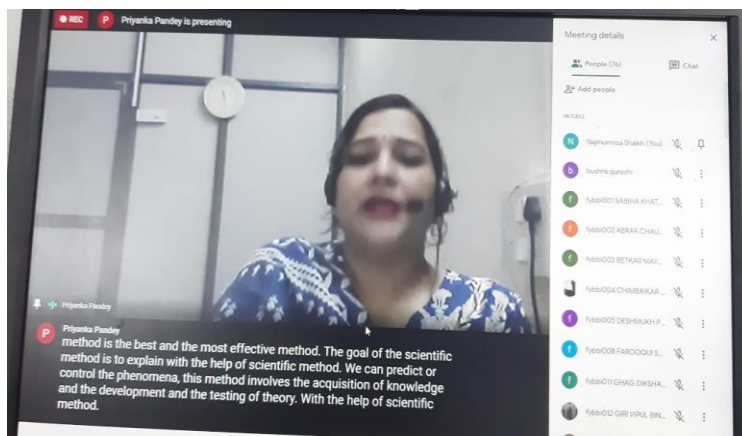
## Webinar on Campus to Corporate Career Program

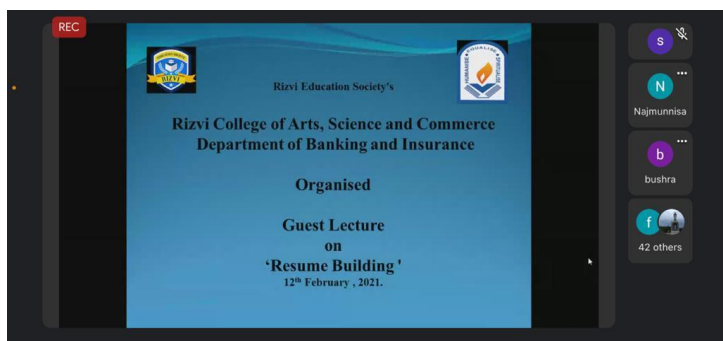
### Guest Lecture on Basic Research in Social Science

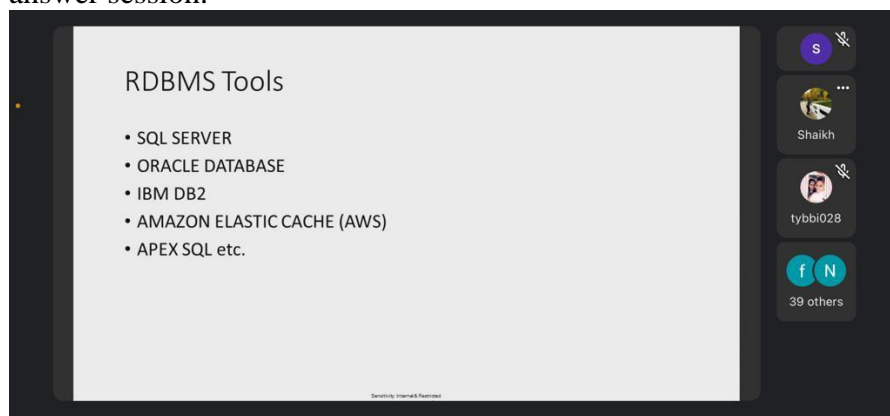
### **Guest Lecture on Resume Building**

## **Online International Conference on Emerging Opportunities and Challenges in Indian Economy an Interdisciplinary Approach**

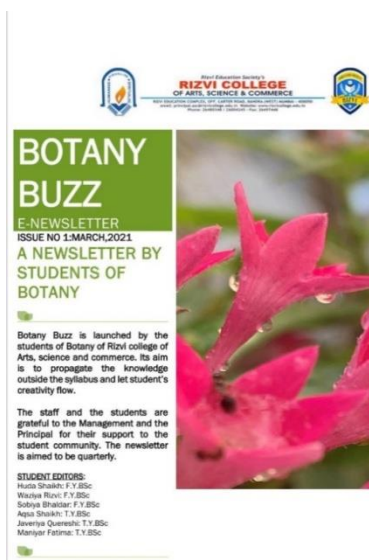

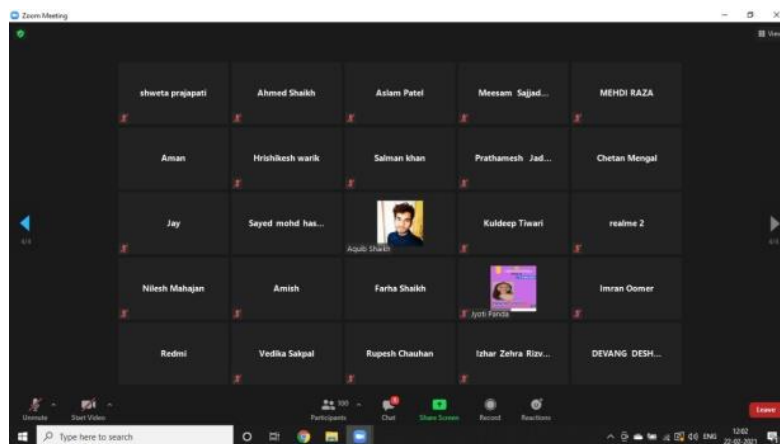
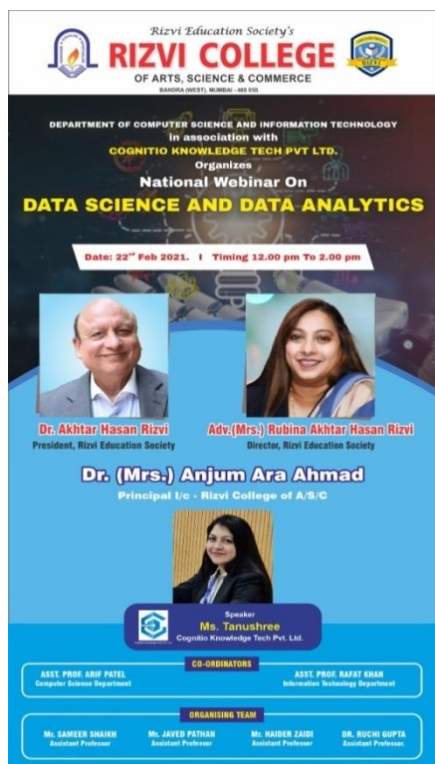


### Webinar on “Data Science and Data Analytics”

## DEPT. OF SOCIOLOGY

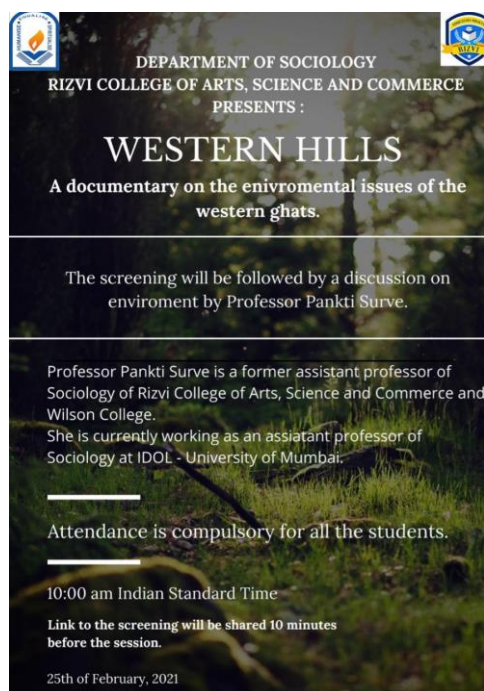
### Intra-class PPT competition

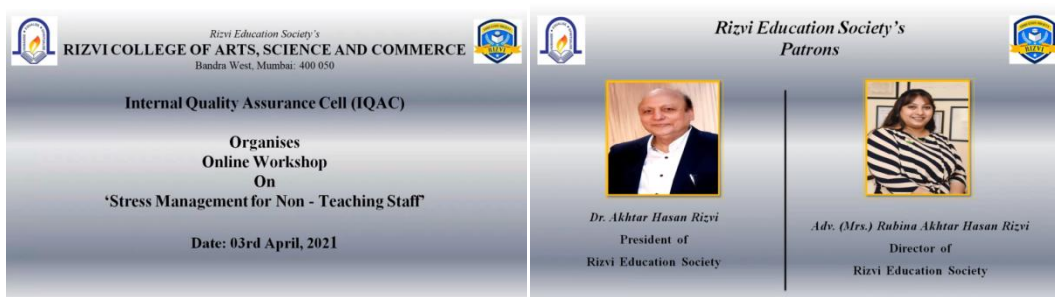

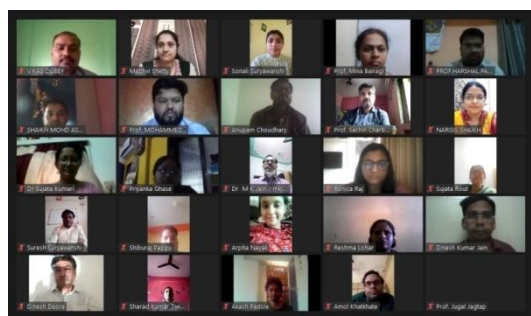
#### 🚩 Online Workshop on ‘Stress Management for Non - Teaching Staff’

# **BEST PRACTICES**

## **Best Practice I**

### **1. Title of the practice**

Financial Patronage - "Help others to achieve their dreams and you will achieve yours."

### **2. Goal**

To provide a financial help to teaching, non-teaching staff & Students of the college.

### **3. The Context**

Financing the college fees is not easy in a country like India where the cost of education is scaling higher day by day. Dr. Rizvi had set up Rizvi Education Society to fulfill his desire to help the less fortunate who are unable to pursue higher education. The stated vision of the college is 'Upliftment of Muslim minority students through Quality Education' to this effect, keeping in mind the rules for minority institutions, Out intake of students ranges from the affluent to the under privileged section of the society as well as quite a few first generations learner's too. We believe in empowering and transforming the lives of the students through education. Helping low income students to continue their education during COVID-19 pandemic. The stay at home orders during the pandemic exacerbated the financial challenges of the citizens. In such situation the college took the steps to provide affordable financial help.

### **4. The Procedure**

A considerable size of our student's population belongs to the lower economic strata. Many a times students find it difficult to pay their fees and therefore managing fees effectively and digitally has become a necessity of educational institute.

1. The management provides them with the option of paying fees in multiple installments in the best possible way or by paying a complete fee to an eligible child, belonging to SC/ST/BC/EBC. Differently Abled categories will be preferred.

2. The management has also very generously set up "Two Scholarships" [ABIS Rizvi minority Educational Scholarship and Saquib Rizvi Sports Scholarship] in academic and sports respectively; to help the needy and deserving student The Cash Prize towards, ABIS A.H. Rizvi Memorial award, for the outstanding performance and academic achievements of Rs 73,875.00 for 5 deserving students by paying their 100% fees or partial.

3. "Sports Free ship" (half/full free ship) is also being given to 04 students of total amount Rs. 20,730.

4. Two students have received a total of Rs 42,283.00 free ship.

## **5. Evidence of Success**

1. Some of the students completed their degree only after receiving the financial support.

## **6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

### **1. Problems Encountered**

- Increase in the number of students/ non-teaching staff who actually needs money either for education or for medical crisis.
- The time gap between the application process & actual sanctioning of the fund should be reduced especially for medical help. Therefore, it is essential for immediate scrutiny of the deserving application, verification and sanction of the application.
- The biggest challenge is identification the deserving candidate. We also have identified that a small cross section of students had missed such help.
- As the numbers of needy students are increasing year after year, the amount of financial support needs to be increased.
- Inability to take advantage of Financial Aid because of the lack of awareness of various types of scholarships that are available in India for financially weaker students like K.C. Mahindra Scholarship, AICTE-scholarship, Central Sector Scheme of scholarship, Cultural Talent Search Scholarship etc.

### **2. Resources Required**

Special Assistance programme by UGC focuses on providing financial support to research base institute & colleges. Therefore more publicity and simple explanation of the application procedures are required and the college may take more aggressive steps towards this awareness creation so that more students can avail the financial help.

## **Best Practice II**

### **1. Title of the Practice**

Online Education: Tools and Techniques

### **2. Goals**

- To keep the spirit of Teaching on during pandemic.
- To help teachers to prepare e-content for library institutional repository and online learning.

### **3. The context**

Online teaching was challenge for most of the teachers at the advent of pandemic. Teachers as well as students were in a fix to adjust them to understand and adopt the online teaching process as different subjects required different online teaching techniques. In such situation the college with the help of library department organised this webinar.

#### **4. Procedure**

Webinar on Online Education: tools and techniques organised by Library department on 6th May, 2020 where 94 teachers participated. Teachers were introduced to various tools and techniques to prepare presentation for study purpose. Some of the tools like Flyer maker App for banner making, Google form for registration and feedback, Cinema FV5 App for video shooting, Kine Master App for video editing and effects, Google Translate App for translating text/file/photo were taught. The Resource Person was Mr. Ramakant Navghare, Librarian, CKT College and Panvel.

#### **5. Evidence of success**

The detailed workshop helped teachers understand the use of various technical and online tools in teaching. All the teachers use Google forms regularly for creating question papers as well as logging in registration details for many events and activities. The workshop and training has boosted the confidence of all non technical teaching staff in their ability to use technical tools to make the teaching learning process more efficient and effective.

#### **6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

- **Problems Encountered**

Familiarizing the faculty members with the online mode was a challenge, especially for those who were resistant towards the use of technology.

- **Resources Required**
