1. CURRICULAR DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

CERTIFICATE COURSE OFFERED IN COLLABORATION

Several short-term Certificate courses of 30 hours or more duration were conducted in the interest of the students and their skill development, to help cover the academia-industry interface. The CSIT Department was the most active conducting seven courses and training programmes alongside their course work. A Certificate Course of 30 hours on “Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking Level 1” was conducted from 11th February, 2022 to 11th April, 2022 by IndiaTech Pvt. Ltd. A total of 64 students attended this course. This was followed by “Cyber Security and Ethical Hacking Level 2” which was conducted from 24th May, 2022 to 6th June, 2022 by IndiaTech Pvt. Ltd. A total of 34 students attended this course. Another Certificate Course of 30 hours on “Data Analysis and Data Science Using Python” was conducted from 23rd February, 2022 to 18th May, 2022 by IndiaTech Pvt. Ltd. which was attended by 38 students. Simultaneously, free Live Virtual training program on “Python for Data Science” was conducted by ExcelR under the MOU, for the duration of 42 hours, starting from 16th May 2022 (14 days, 3 hours daily) from 11Am to 2pm everyday, on weekdays. A total of 30 students registered for this course. Students were taught the concepts of Dictionaries, Data Handling, Numpy, Pandas, Data Wrangling, Data Visualization and Web Scraping. A second free Live Virtual training program was also conducted on “Cloud Fundamentals” for the duration of 30 hours, starting from 20th June 2022 from 7pm to 9pm everyday, on weekdays. Topics covered were Cloud Basics, Azure, GCP and AWS. A total of 42 students registered for this course. This was followed by another free Live Virtual training program on “Introduction to R programming and Tableau” for the duration of 30 hours, starting from 11th July 2022 from 7PM to 9PM every day, on weekdays. A total of 8 students registered for this course. Students were taught Data Types and data structures in R, Data Visualization, Data Connections, Organizing Data, Fields and Charts and Sharing Insights. Lastly, an online course on “C and C++” was conducted in association with Spoken Tutorial during July – December 2021 session. A total of 8 students enrolled in the course. Our BAF Department conducted three short term certificate courses in “Advanced Microsoft Excel”, “Tally ewith GST” and “GST Return Filing” in February, March and April 2022 respectively. All the three courses were conducted in association with Growmore Academy and were successfully completed by 42 students each. Department of English and Department of BAMMC jointly conducted a Certificate course in “Content Writing” from 21st February to 11th march 2022 which was attended by 25 students. 15 students successfully completed a certificate course in “Soap Making” conducted by Department of Sociology in February 2022. A course in “Bioesthetics” was conducted by the Department od Botany in December 2021.

2. TEACHING - LEARNING AND EVALUATION PROCESS

ADMISSION PROCESS

The Admission Committee of the college comprising the Principal, Vice-Principal, Heads of the Departments and senior faculty ensures that the admission process is widely publicized and transparent. The Admissions Committee annually reviews its admission process to provide equal representation from all sections of the society. The success of the review mechanism is evidenced by the ever increasing demand for admissions over the past few years.

In the admission process the applicants are counselled by the faculty to create an awareness among the students regarding Courses offered, Career Prospects, campus culture, rules and regulations and various other Add - On and Certificate Courses designed for the holistic development of the students to help them in choosing the right course.

- **CRITERIA FOR UG ADMISSIONS**

1. Admission will be, strictly, on merit basis. In case, where aided as well unaided division/seat/subjects are available after filling the aided division/seats/subjects, admission will be granted for unaided division/seats/subjects for which, the fee structure is different (Ref. Fees Chart).
2. The college has been granted the “Minority Status” therefore admission will be granted according to rules and regulations applicable to this Category. Fifty percent seats in all courses & classes are reserved for Muslim minority.
3. Those who fail to pay the prescribed fees within the stipulated time will forfeit their claim for admission.
4. Repeaters and working students will not be granted admission
5. Students from other colleges will be admitted only if seats are available, after granting admission to in-house students after requisite permission from the competent authority and verification of their original documents.
6. All admissions will be subject to the guidelines of the University of Mumbai and Education Department Government of Maharashtra received from time to time and as decided by the Rizvi Education Society.
7. Students seeking admission must apply in the prescribed form at the beginning of each academic year.

8. A student once admitted will be considered as duly enrolled for the academic year and the student shall be liable to pay the full fees for the whole year unless, the student informs the principal in writing of his/her intention to leave the college well in advance.
9. Students granted admission to First year in unaided division will continue in unaided division of Second Year and Third Year.

- **PRE - ADMISSION FORM**

Students seeking admission in FYJC (XI) Arts/Sci/Com/MCVC and FYBA/BSc/BSc (CS)/BSc (IT)/ B.Com/BMM/BMS//BBI/BAF/B.Sc.(HS) and M.Com, should fill online only admission form on the basis of Admission vouchers which will be available at the office counter. In case of students belonging to Muslim/Reserved Category should also submit the Xerox of relevant document to claim Admission under the quota for the minority category. Printout of Admission form will be accepted after declaration of the merit list for granting the admission.

- **Reserved Category**

Students belonging to reserved category and staying in Aided Courses should submit the application form for “freeship” available in the college office with the required documents as per the chart, along with, all documents mentioned above.

Students should keep 5 xerox copies of each document they are submitting for the admission for future record.

- **Second Year / Third Year Admission**

B.A / B.Sc. / B.Com. / B.Sc. (Computer Science)/B.Sc. (HS)

Students seeking Admission in SY/TY classes in different courses are required to fill in “online” admission form and submit a copy of admission form as per schedule declared for admissions. Such forms are to be submitted on declaration of FY/SY results at the end of continuous year, along with, the copies of all mark sheets of earlier examinations in which, he / she has passed or secured ATKT making him/her eligible to admit in SY/TY classes.

- **CONTINUATION OF ADMISSION**

BMM / B.Sc. (I.T) / BMS / BBI / BAF

Students of I/III/V semesters seeking admissions in II/IV/VI semesters are required to submit continuation of admission form before the beginning of Sem-II/IV/VI as per schedule declared for admission. Such forms should be accompanied by Original and Xerox copies of mark sheets of all lower Semesters in which the student has appeared earlier and declared Passed or Secured ATKT, making him/her eligible for higher semesters. No student will be allowed to attend classes or to appear in the examination of respective semesters, if he/she has not paid the fees of respective semester.

- **Rules of Refund of Fees**

Application for refund of fees shall be made in the prescribed form available in the college office. The refund of fees in professional courses is done on priority basis, as they are unaided course. No refund of fees is made even on priority basis after last day of admission as per University instructions. A student applying for discontinuation and refund of fees shall surrender, the Identity Card and the Library Reader’s ticket, if issued to him/her & original fees receipt, along with, his/her application

- **CAUTION MONEY & DEPOSITS**

1. The caution money and the deposits will be refunded to the student, when he / she leave, the college after completion of the course of study or cancels his/her admission.
2. The student has to apply in prescribed form for the above refund and will be required to submit the original fee receipt and Identity Card, along with, the application for refund.
3. The caution money and deposits, not claimed within a period of twelve month from the date of result of the last examination will stand forfeited.

EDUCATION PROCESS AT RIZVI COLLEGE

At Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce our commitment to Quality Education and Training propelled the growth of our students. We shape our students by honing their skills, instilling a sense of responsibility in nation building by cherishing humane values. In our efforts towards the above mentioned goal, we have introduced different courses to bridge the gap between the institution and the industry. We assess the students' strengths and weaknesses in academics and aptitude and address their needs through various Bridge Courses, Certificate Courses, Courses on Personality Development and Life Skills. Use of Information & Communication Technology(ICT) and other visual aids support, enhance, and optimise the delivery of information in education by integrating technology to the curriculum has a significant and positive impact on students' achievements. Our students are exposed to technology through education to have better 'knowledge', presentation skills, innovative capabilities, so that they are ready to take more efforts into learning as compared to their counterparts. Bridge Courses, Remedial & Tutorial Classes, Assignments, Seminars, Guest Lectures, Workshops, Pre-Placement activities are an integral part of teaching learning process to enhance the student learning abilities.

- **STUDENT ORIENTATION & INDUCTION PROGRAM**

Orientation Programme strives to create a safe and caring environment committed to enhancing students overall growth through a variety of opportunities and experiences. It aims to provide information and resources that will allow students to make informed and appropriate academic plans and healthy social choices.

- **ORIENTATION/INDUCTION PROGRAMME FOR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS**

Orientation/Induction Programme facilitates transition and integration of students into the college learning environment and gives them a sense of belonging. It aims to create an atmosphere that minimizes anxiety, promotes positive attitude and stimulates an excitement for learning.

A Library Orientation for Students was conducted from 6th to 10th December, 2021. 294 students attended this orientation that was conducted in a phased manner. First year students were introduced to

the library and its facilities. They were taught to access books through Web Opac and to access E-resources through library website www.librarydrdl.com

Offline session was conducted for students where they were informed about the library facilities. They were encouraged to and shown how to make use of our library e-resources through our library website. Various features of our website www.librarydrdl.com were explained to them.

TUTORIALS AND REMEDIAL CLASSES

Rizvi College assesses the learning level of students through semester end exams as per the guidelines given by the University of Mumbai. In case of certain departments, particularly science departments, students are assessed with their laboratory skill also & continued by viva voce examination at the end of semester. As per the guidelines by University of Mumbai from time to time, internal assessment/assignment/ presentations are the part of curriculum.

Since the students have different learning abilities, the institute initiated remedial coaching for slow learners, and every department sets the time table for remedial coaching for weak students. For Advanced learners, institute motivate the students by orientation program to appear for competitive exams and to join online courses like **NPTEL, SWAYAM** etc. Periodical classes are conducted for both advanced and slow learners. This practice is part of a blended learning system.

TEACHING – LEARNING TECHNIQUES USED

Student's centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences. All science programs integrate practical courses as a part of curriculum, which provides adequate experimental learning skill, along with practical hands-on skill practice for students. Participative learning involves project presentation, industrial visit, botanical Excursion, visit to research and medical instruments laboratories.

Programs like NSS, NCC inculcate among the students for practice for participative learning.

Few departments have projects as a curriculum that provides opportunity to the students for incorporating and practicing problem solving methodologies. Participative learning also involves the workshop (Online/Offline) and debate competition poster making competition which provides students to actively participate with peers and experience the learning.

A well-defined process of course allotment and load distribution is adopted at departmental level. Course allocation is made based on choice and specialization of the faculty members before commencement of the semester. Once courses are allotted, faculty members prepare as per the teaching plan and curriculum prescribed by University. Some of the pedagogical method used is i) chalk and board ii) industrial visits and iii) laboratory learning. These are further supported by the following techniques:

- ICT backed Teaching using Computers, LCD Projectors, Internet Facility
- 02 Computer Labs with updated Software in the area of specialization and Browsing centers
- Library Resources
- Learning Management System: Digital Edu
- Screening Documentaries & Feature Films

• **TEACHING METHODOLOGY & TEACHING TOOLS**

The institute follows ICT enabled teaching in addition to traditional class room education/ teaching learning. Sub-sequent efforts are taken by institution to provide e-learning. In addition to chalk and board method of teaching the faculty members use the IT enabled learning tools such as PPT, Video clipping to expose students for advanced knowledge and practical learning. Classrooms are fully equipped with LCD projector and computer with Wi-Fi facilities. Well security is provided to Wi-Fi users. Most of the faculty use interactive methods for teaching. The major emphasis is on classroom interaction in terms of seminar, assignment, laboratory work etc.

The analysis of feedback received from the participants and the number of participants depict the success of the FDP.



STUDENT MEGA EVENTDIGIFEST 2 (2021-22)

In an attempt to infuse our pupils with some joy and laughter, to give them some time to play and enjoy themselves as children should, to be worry-free for a while away from the stresses of the Pandemic, to engage in their interests, and to celebrate their talents, last year our College's Cultural Committee decided to plan a festival for the students. Thus was born DIGIFEST – a cultural festival that was staged on a digital platform for the first time in the institution's history. The pilot version had participation from Degree College only. This year we were joined by the Junior college as well. The scale of the event increased wherein number of competitions went up from 15 to 28 and student participation went up from 200 to 700. DIGIFEST 2 was held on 5th and 6th of February 2022.

Our annual inter collegiate mega fest Jashn-E-Rizvi couldn't be organized due to Covid restrictions and mandate. So, instead, a plethora of events were organized at the intra collegiate Digifest 2. 28 competitive activities covering a range of both traditional and contemporary skill sets made up the festival. While the traditional favorites like Solo Singing, Solo Dance, Personality Contest, Mehendi Designing and Mobile Photography were the first to be added, new competitions like Face Painting, Tongue Twisters, Insta Reels, Bottle Gardening and Instant Hijab turned out to be crowd pullers. A total of 705 students took part in various events. The festival was spread out across two days with an online opening ceremony on the 5th of February where our Principal Incharge Dr. AnjumAra Ahmed inaugurated the function and Mrs. Swati Vora and Mrs. Shahista Shaikh, Convenors of Cultural Committee – Degree and Junior College Respectively, welcomed everyone to the festival. The invitation to participate had been sent out considerably earlier, so students entered their individual contests on time, either to compete or to watch. On Feb 8th, the valedictory ceremony took place, during which the winners of each competition were announced.

Without the assistance of the Management, who has always had the best interests of the students in mind, this Fest would not have been feasible. This event was conceived thanks to the inspirational vision of our principal incharge, Dr. AnjumAra Ahmed, and the Convenor of the Cultural Committee, Mrs. Swati Vora. The Cultural Committee members all put forth a lot of effort and collaborated well to

make the event a success. A particular mention and word of gratitude to Mr. Haider Zaidi, technical in charge, and his team for guaranteeing a glitch-free event.

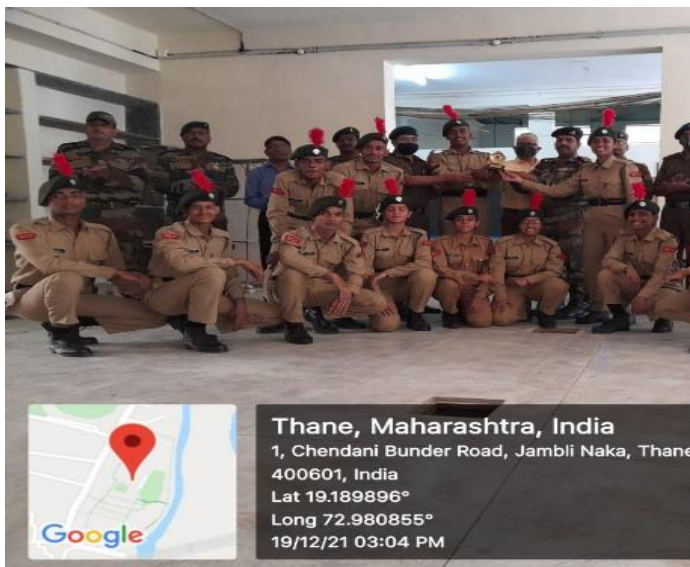


NATIONAL CADET CORPS

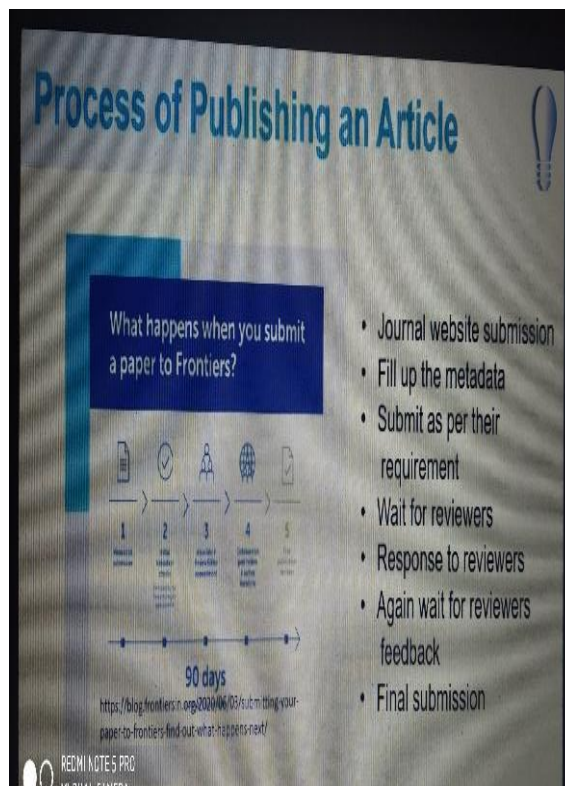
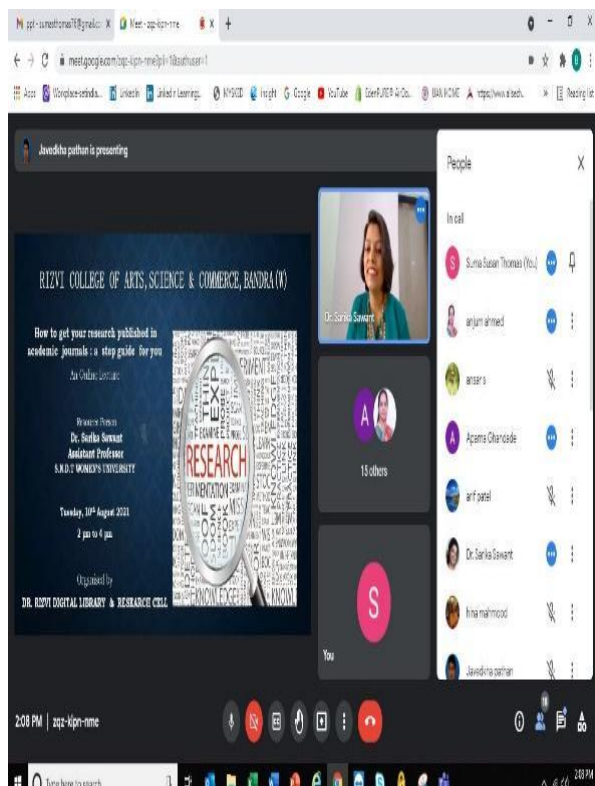


LIBRARY

Library has played an important role in promoting online learning and use of e resources during the pandemic to facilitate online teaching and learning. 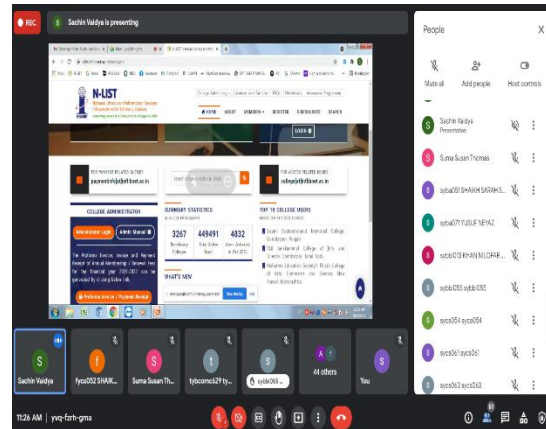
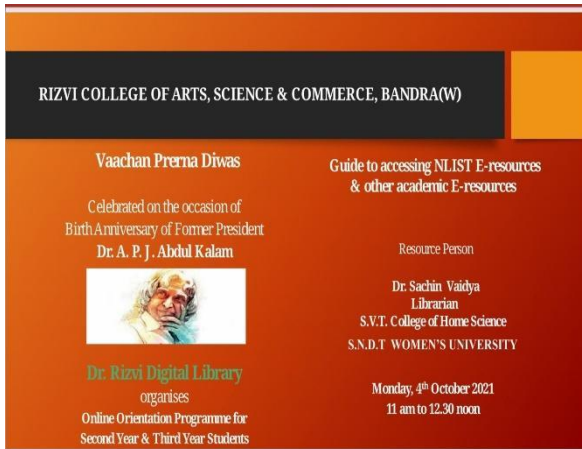




2) Online orientation program Guide to accessing NLIST e-resources and other academic e-resources” 4th October, 2021 (62 students)

4) I Love my Library Initiative : Competition on Library Opinion Essays and Library Facts. 28th January, 2022

To promote library and library resources usage, a competition was organised for the students. Students had to write opinion essays on Library related topics to gauge their knowledge on current state of reading culture among youth, future of print books, difference between google and books . They had to write their opinion on these topics and submit handwritten essays. Under Library facts, questions were asked to understand whether they know basic facts about the college library. Marks were given based on essay content and questions answered. Prize winners were given books as present .



5) Literature Search and Review: the base of Research Process

2nd March 2022 (14 Teachers attended)

Dr.Rizvi Digital Library and Research Cell organised an Online lecture on Literature Search and Review: the base of research process, by Dr. Sushma Powdwal , Retd. University Librarian, SNDDT

Women's University for our teachers on 2nd March 2022. Literature search and review is the most important step of any research process, hence to add value to the research done by our teachers, this lecture was organised. Dr. Sushma Powdwal gave information on objectives of Literature review and steps to write a literature review. Steps to conduct Gap Analysis was also looked upon. Different Literature search tools, sources and resources which can be used to refine the search output were explained. Tips on searching skills like which terms, signs, Boolean operators to be used were shared by the resource person. Examples of different online resources available like e- journal databases, institutional repositories, thesis database, consortium were given to find the relevant information for research. The teachers gained added knowledge to sharpen their research focus.

CAREER INSIGHTS: Prepare for your future with assistance to career options in your fields, 21st February, 2022.

The Career Project team of the Department of Life Long Learning and Extension of Rizvi Education Society's Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce had organized an Intra-College Activity on Career Insights, 21st of February, 2022. The activity took place between 08:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

The motive of conducting the activity was to give the under graduate students, an insight about the career options available after completing their graduation. A minor research on careers available for the students after completing their Bachelors in Commerce, Science, Arts, Bachelor of Information Technology, Computer Science, Accounts and Finance, Banking and Insurance, Management Studies and Bachelor of Arts Mass Media and Communication was conducted. An oral presentation on various careers was shared with students in their respective classes; handout of the same was also displayed on corridor notice board, soft copy in the form of pdf file of the handout was also shared with students through WhatsApp groups; thereby allowing the students to get access to the list of careers whenever they require. Activity was conducted in 7 classes, with around 180 students (FYBMS-B, SYBAF, FYB.Com-B, SYBBI, SYBA, SYB.Sc., FYBAMMC.)

The research done by the Career Project team has helped them in understanding the features of conducting research and helped to enhance presentation skills. The activity was collectively conducted under the guidance of the DLLE Convener, Staff and the Student Managers. The entire activity was a great experience for the team.

Online National Level Inter-Collegiate Essay Writing Competition 2021-22, 14th February, 2022.

The Department of Life Long Learning and Extension of Rizvi Education Society's Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce had organized an Online National Level Inter-Collegiate Essay Writing Competition, 2021-22. The essay writing competition was organized to create awareness about and let the young mind to think on the important cross-cutting issues of the times so that they can learn, explore and extend their knowledge to help and enrich the disadvantaged section of the society.

The competition was organized on online mode. A Google form was created for registration and the link was shared along with the brochure of the event via emails to the DLLE In charges of

various colleges and via various social media platforms like Facebook, Whatsapp, and Instagram. There was no registration fee for the event and the last date of registration was Monday, 14th February 2022.

The topics for the essay writing competition were chosen keeping in mind the various project options the DLLE students were supposed to work on like:

Survey of Women Status: *Women Empowerment: The Right of Women in India and ways of Promoting it.*

National Institute Open School: *Impact of COVID 19 on Primary And Secondary Education: is NIOS an Option in the Current Situation.*

Career Project: *Affect of Pandemic on Indian Economy and Scope for Entrepreneurship in the Present Hour.*

Population Education Club: *New Education Policy 2020: Highlights and Changes.*

The competition received 65 relevant entries out of 70 registrations (4 were found irrelevant whereas 1 entry was a repetitive one, for irrelevant entries an email was shared to respective participants as their registration was disqualified) Gender wise there were 44 Female and 21 Male, valid registration from many different colleges across the region. Majority of the essays were on the topic on Women Empowerment: The Right of Women in India and ways of Promoting it with 44 entries. 05 essays received for the topic Impact of COVID 19 on Primary and Secondary Education: Is NIOS an Option in the Current Situation, 09 for Affect of Pandemic on Indian Economy and Scope for Entrepreneurship in the present hour and 07 for New Education Policy 2020: Highlights and Changes.

The results were declared after a week on Monday 21st February, 2022. (had four winners overall). The first prize was won by Aishawarya Balaji from SVKM's Pravin Gandhi College of Law for topic on SWS. Second prize was secured by two participants (it was a tie between two essays) Madhuri Ram Dhongade from Shri Bhausaheb Vartak Arts, Science & Commerce College for topic on PEC and Ghazi Mahsham Anees from Swayam Sidhhi Degree Night College for topic on NIOS. The third prize was given to Rishikesh Hodawadekar, Oriental College of Pharmacy for topic on SWS. On the same day E-Certificates were emailed on participants email id, which were shared during registration, overall 4 winners and 65 e-certificates were emailed.

DLLE Committee Members-Dr. DattatrayPrahard, Dr. Suhana Khan,Mrs. SujataKharat and Student Manager - Miss PragatiJitendraMallah and Mr. Rizwan Khan contributed immensely for the event. Principal In-charge Dr. (Mrs.)AnjumAra Ahmed was a constant guiding force for the success of the event.

Self Defense Workshop, 22nd February, 2022

Rizvi Education Society's Rizvi College of Arts, Science and Commerce, The Survey of Women Status team of the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension in collaboration with Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad had organized a Self-defense Workshop on 22nd of February, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. in the College Auditorium.

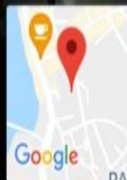
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DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS AND STATISTICS

In a bid to help our students beyond the academics and towards fulfilling the departmental social responsibility, the department of English organized various activities during the academic year 2021-2022.

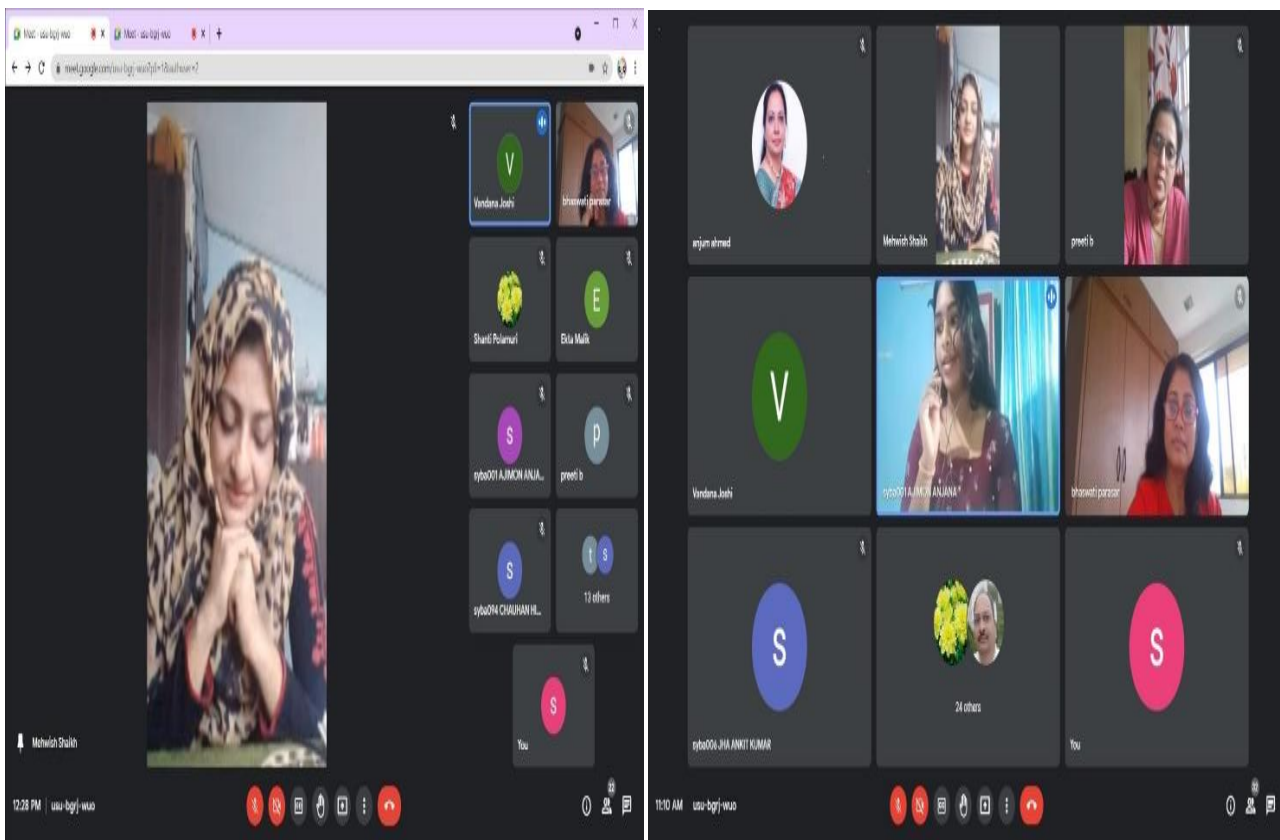

Later we moved ahead for a little enjoyment at Chota Kashmir for enjoying the view of nature through boat ride and other fun adventure activities.




DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS LAW

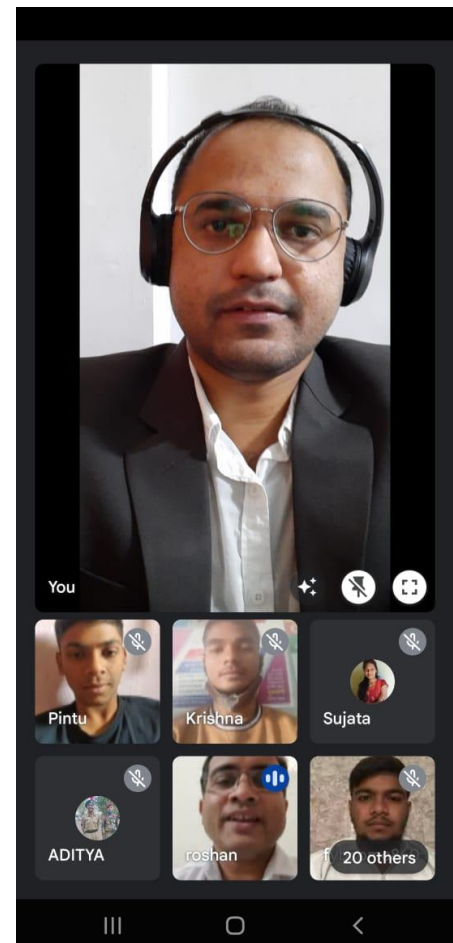

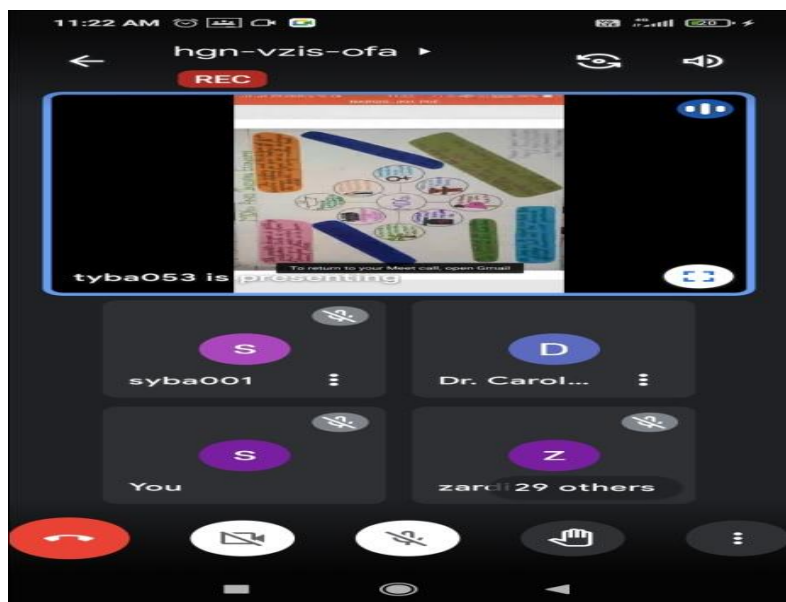

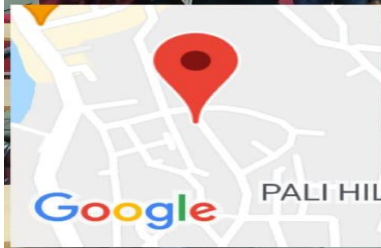

The Home page has sections for Notices& Announcement, recent events, sports club and cultural club. The Notices/Announcement section is updated with daily notices for junior/degree/masters students. Recent events section is updated regularly with report and photos of events conducted in the college. Website is updated with pages on innovations, hall of fame with achievements of students, Certificate courses , excursions and field trips. Newsletters of different departments are posted regularly. Sports achievements are updated on Rizvi Sports Club webpage and are also highlighted on home page. NCC and NSS activities are regularly posted on the website. Roll call lists are posted on the website for the access of students and so is the timetable. Exam related notices, seat numbers and results are posted on the results webpage from time to time. Admission related notices are put on online-admission webpage during admissions of both junior and degree colleges. Merit lists are posted on the merit lists webpage. Important announcements are highlighted by putting them as scrolling text(marquee) on the webpage. Direct links for Swayam Online Courses, anti ragging grievance/complaint and Dr. Rizvi digital library is put on home page for quick access. Important links such as examination, roll call list and admission link during admission time are provided as highlighted red circles on home page for ease of access.

Best Practice I

Best Practice I:

1. Title of the practice

Financial Patronage - "Help others to achieve their dreams and you will achieve yours."

2. Goal

To provide a financial help to teaching, non-teaching staff & Students of the college.

3. The Context

Financing the college fees is not easy in a country like India where the cost of education is scaling higher day by day. Dr. Rizvi had set up Rizvi Education Society to fulfill his desire to help the less fortunate who are unable to pursue higher education. The stated vision of the college is 'Upliftment of Muslim minority students through Quality Education' to this effect, keeping in mind the rules for minority institutions, Out intake of students ranges from the affluent to the under privileged section of the society as well as quite a few first generations learner's too. We believe in empowering and transforming the lives of the students through education. Helping low income students to continue their education during COVID-19 pandemic. The stay at home orders during the pandemic exacerbated the financial challenges of the citizens. In such situation the college took the steps to provide affordable financial help.

4. The Procedure

A considerable size of our student's population belongs to the lower economic strata. Many a times students find it difficult to pay their fees and therefore managing fees effectively and digitally has become a necessity of educational institute.

i) The management provides them with the option of paying fees in multiple instalments in the best possible way or by paying a complete fee to an eligible child, belonging to SC/ST/BC/EBC. Differently Abled categories will be preferred.

ii) The management has also very generously set up “Two Scholarships” [ABIS Rizvi minority Educational Scholarship and Saquib Rizvi Sports Scholarship] in academic and sports respectively; to help the needy and deserving student. Abis Rizvi Minority Scholarship 2021-2022 was given to 12 deserving students. A total of Rs 1,83,970 was given.

iii) Saqib Rizvi “Sports Freeship 2021-2022” (half/full freeship) is also being given to 14 students of total amount Rs.1,94,756

iv) A freeship given to the students from various Outsider Trust , 26 students received freeship of Rs 1,51,689

Compare to last year's sports freeships-this year the amount has been increased considerably.

5. Evidence of Success

i) Some of the students completed their degree only after receiving the financial support.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

i) Increase in the number of students/ non-teaching staff who actually needs money either for education or for medical crisis.

ii) The time gap between the application process & actual sanctioning of the fund should be reduced especially for medical help. Therefore, it is essential for immediate scrutiny of the deserving application, verification and sanction of the application.

iii) The biggest challenge is identification the deserving candidate. We also have identified that a small cross section of students had missed such help.

iv) As the numbers of needy students are increasing year after year, the amount of financial support needs to be increased.

v) Inability to take advantage of Financial Aid because of the lack of awareness of various types of scholarships that are available in India for financially weaker students like K.C. Mahindra Scholarship, AICTE-scholarship, Central Sector Scheme of scholarship, Cultural Talent Search Scholarship etc.

Special Assistance programme by UGC focuses on providing financial support to research base institute & colleges. Therefore more publicity and simple explanation of the application procedures are required and the college may take more aggressive steps towards this awareness creation so that more students can avail the financial help.
