Activity Report 2017-2018

1. 53rd A. D. Shroff Memorial Elocution Competition:

On 23rd September 2017, the students participated in the 53rd A. D. Shroff Memorial Elocution Competition.





2. Syllabus Revision Workshop for SYBA:

On 1st July 2017, a Syllabus Revision Workshop was held for SYBA wherein teachers from colleges all across Mumbai attended this workshop.

3. Movie Screening- *Pride and Prejudice*

On 19th September 2017, the 2005 adaptation of the Jane Austen's literary classic, 'Pride and Prejudice' was screened for the students within the college premises. This adaptation was screened to acquaint the students with the visual aesthetic of the life and times of Jane Austen as *Pride and Prejudice* was one of the prescribed text for the FYBA.

4. Introductory session with Ms. Uma Iyer, COO of HeyDeeDee:

On 30 January 2018, an Introductory session was held with Ms. Uma Iyer, COO of *HeyDeeDee* (the first app for women drivers and delivery partners). The talk intended to throw light on career opportunities for girls in male dominated domains like driving and deliveries.



5. Spoken English Course:

Certificated course conducted in collaboration with Times of India's Teach India Initiative. Dept of English and IQAC of Rizvi College of Arts, science and Commerce in association with the Times of India have conducted two cycles of a Certificate course in Spoken English for two and a half months each. The programme focuses on imparting Spoken English Skills to youth for better employability. The curriculum which was designed by the British Council is distributed over a period of two and a half months, two hours a day, six days a week in the College premises.
